QR Code Assessment Take Action – Jan 3, 2020 through Jan 31, 2020

As facilitators of various workshops and local events, we have the opportunity to engage members and stakeholders in real-time actions. Through this embedded process, we will walk participants through a live take-action focused on reducing statewide assessment at the high school level. Facilitators should project the QR Code PowerPoint slide and then review the following.

Introductory Script:

The New Jersey State Department of Education is aiming to reduce the required assessments at the high school level from 6 assessments down to 4 assessments. However, the State Board of Education is not fully in agreement with this proposal and would like to explore additional testing at the high school level.

The State BOE seeks public comment on the proposed regulations and needs to hear member and community voices! We are going to engage in a "live" take action. Please take out your cell phones/devices and open your camera app.

[Facilitators walk participants through the following steps, noted below]

1. Project QR Code PowerPoint Slide for participants
2. Review introduction with participants
3. Have participants take out their cell phones / devices
4. Open Camera App
5. Point Camera App at QR Code on Slide
6. Device should prompt participant to open web link to Take Action
7. Participants complete Take Action and click submit
8. Facilitators should note the number of responses on the Take Action before and after the participants complete it. Based on the number of folks in the room, encourage them to see the number grow by at least 50% of the participant group.

Facilitators should walk through the crowd and assist folks as needed, provide encouragement as the numbers increase, and answer questions. Direct participants to email assessment@njea.org if there are questions that cannot be answered on the spot.
